West Hill Public Footpaths - Annual Survey 2024

#### Purpose of this paper

- To receive the annual survey of West Hill Public Footpaths and to consider recommendations.
- To seek approval for the annual grant submission the Parish Paths Partnership

#### 1. Background

The Parish Paths Partnerships Scheme (also known as the P3 scheme) is a Devon County Council initiative to ensure that the rights of way network is properly maintained and well publicised. The scheme seeks to encourage community involvement and enjoyment of public rights of way. It has the support of the National Association of Local Councils and is Devon County Council funded.

As a member of the scheme West Hill Parish Council can apply for an annual grant to undertake rights of way work. The grant, paid by Devon County Council, covers:

- The mileage, based on the length of rights of way in your parish.
- Special projects.

Each year West Hill's Footpath Warden Eileen Perkins undertakes an Annual Survey of the Public Footpaths in the Parish. This is an assessment of the condition of the rights of way, in order to find out what work needs to be done. The survey also identifies developments and possible improvements such as vegetation clearance, repairing stiles and waymarking which would require consultation with DCC and landowners.

The survey provides the information necessary for calculation of WHPC's annual grant request. In previous years the Council has successfully submitted a grant request to fund a 2<sup>nd</sup> maintenance cut of Footpaths 1,5 and 7 (approx. £300+vat). The Warden's report is presented to the Council in January/February prior to the submission of the annual grant application. The deadline for submission of the 2024/25 application is **Friday 15**<sup>th</sup> **March.** 

#### 2. Annual Footpath Report

West Hill Footpath Warden Eileen Perkins carried out the survey of all of West Hill's public footpaths during December 2023 and January 2024. Three paths were given a "Fail rating" as follows (Appendix 1 gives a report on each of the footpaths):

- b. Footpath Warden to liaise with DCC's Public Rights of Way team to establish which, if any, of the actions they will undertake directly.
- c. Annual grant application to the Parish Paths Partnership to be presented to the WHPC Meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> March 2024.
