Queen's Platinum Jubilee

2022 is a special year when we will all be celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Events and activities are being planned across the whole country during the year, and especially during the Big Weekend from 2nd to 5th June. The Parish Council has been busy helping West Hill's groups and organisations with various plans for the four day holiday (and other events during the year).

What's happening in West Hill?

- **West Hill's Jubilee Oak**, kindly donated by East Devon District Council, has been planted on the green at Courtfield Close. Thank you to nearby residents who offered to care for the tree.



- West Hill Garden Club have planted a commemorative oak tree on the green at Beech Park.

Both trees have been registered with the Queen's Green Canopy. So far, 47 trees have been registered in West Hill. Do let us know if you register a tree!

- West Hill PTFA will be holding a jubilee street party for all the primary children on the last day before the half-term holiday. Each pupil will be given a **commemorative 'Jubilee' medal** funded by the Parish Council.
- The Royal British Legion will be flying the Union Jack on their newly installed commemorative **Jubilee flag pole** at the Legion Club (*partly funded by a grant award from WHPC*).
- With the support of St Michael's Church, the Parish Council will be planting a **Covid Memorial tree** and siting a **Jubilee bench** in the new community garden area at the far end of the graveyard as a memorial to those that have died during the COVID-19 pandemic. It will be a space for quiet contemplation and remembrance of loved ones who have passed away during this difficult time.
- West Hill Pre-school will be holding a **Scarecrow Competition** with a 'royalty' theme during the half-term and Big Weekend to raise funds (*and have fun!*). It's open to everyone in the village. During the long covid lockdowns the RBL team have been busy re-furbishing the clubhouse on School Lane. They've also been busy submitting (successful!) grant applications to fund further work to improve facilities and the green credentials of the building itself.

The Legion has been fortunate in attracting their first ever "major" National Lottery Community Fund Grant of £45k for refurbishment of the Club interior (a tier above the £10k "Grants for all" that they have previously received from the Lottery). Community groups such as the West Hill Womens Group and the Parish Council were keen to support their bid for a grant. The money will be used for the

- Replacement of the old fire exits with new disability compliant automatic opening fire exits;
- New more energy efficient double glazing; Replacement interior doors; New floor coverings throughout the building; New tables and chairs for the main lounge;
- Re-decoration and refurbishment of the Snooker room

Post covid lockdown the RBL is looking forward to a "normal" season of events with both members and our wider village community able to enjoy our facilities and catching up with friends old and new

New Local Plan for East Devon: Latest News

One of the key responsibilities for East Devon District Council (EDDC) is to create a **Local Plan**.

EDDC has started work on the review of the Local Plan. The revised Local Plan will determine how much, and where, development there will be in East Devon up to 2040.

One of the aims of the plan is to meet the **Housing Need** figure.

The Housing Need figure, which is calculated according to a government-imposed formula, has recently been revised. East Devon now needs **946 new houses per year**, increased from 918 per year. This is because one of the factors used in the calculation is the “affordability ratio” which is calculated by dividing median house prices by median gross annual workplace-based earnings. Recent rises in house prices have pushed this ratio upwards.

What is a Local Plan?

Local Plans are used to help decide on planning applications and other planning related decisions. In effect, they are the local guide to what can be built where, shaping infrastructure investments and determining the future pattern of development in the district

Where will the new houses be built?

Two-thirds of the East Devon is covered by Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONBs) and others are subject to environmental constraints. Development in these areas is tightly controlled. As a result development to achieve the housing target has to be focussed on the parts of East Devon outside the AONBs.

Following on from a motion proposed by our District Councillor Cllr Bailey, EDDC considered the housing target to be unfair as it did not consider the constraints of the AONBs. They agreed to write to Michael Gove, Minister for Levelling Up, to challenge use of the standard formula in East Devon. The reply from Mr Gove was not helpful, and so the need remains to produce a local plan that meets the identified housing need in full.

Timetable

Because of the extra work needed, the draft Local Plan will now not be ready until the autumn, at which stage there will be a public consultation.

The timetable is now as follows:

- Draft plan – consultation starting Autumn 2022
- Publication – consultation starts Autumn 2023
- Submission – early 2024
- Inspector’s Hearings – 2024
- Adoption – early 2025

The working draft of the Local Plan has been discussed extensively in meetings of the East Devon District Council (EDDC) Strategic Planning Committee. District Councillor Jess Bailey sits on this committee and has been working hard to make improvements, and to hopefully rule out some of the more worrying options for extra housing around West Hill. For more details see Cllr Bailey’s reports to WHPC which are published on our website along with the Agendas for Council Meetings.

Important points from discussion of the working draft of the Local Plan

- The hierarchy of settlements has been agreed, so that most development should go to the higher tiers – Exmouth and the major towns of East Devon. There should be no more than about 10% growth in Tier 4 villages such as West Hill unless exceptional circumstances or infrastructure comes alongside supported by evidence such as the Neighbourhood Plan or with infrastructure attachments to it. This should mean no more than about 80 new houses for West Hill.
- There will be a feasibility study on the proposed 2nd new town – between the A3052 and the A30, between West Hill and Exeter. There are strong reasons to support another new town to help meet the housing need, but there remain serious concerns over the provision of the necessary infrastructure, which should be explored in the feasibility study. If a new town is not possible, there will be much greater pressure on existing settlements to provide the additional housing.
- There were options in the working draft for significant extra housing around villages, including a possible 470 houses around West Hill. This option was **not** supported by the Strategic Planning Committee.
- The "green wedge" policy is to be reviewed, with additional areas (including between Ottery St Mary and West Hill) to be assessed for inclusion. This would restrict further housing in the green wedge and prevent coalescence of the settlements, and would reinforce the policy we have in our Neighbourhood Plan.
- There is currently a further "call for sites" to identify possible land for development. This should be targeted on the major towns, where development is more sustainable, and on identifying brownfield sites or redevelopment sites. Town and parish councils should be involved in this exercise, though to date this has not happened.
- The East Devon Housing and Employment Land Availability Assessment (HELAA) panel has produced an interim report. This assesses sites identified from the 2017 and 2021 Call for sites submissions, identifying a significant amount of land as being available, suitable, and achievable in the district. A more detailed assessment of individual sites should be ready by the summer.

Strategic Policy – Settlement Hierarchy

This proposed strategic policy will set out the following settlement *hierarchy*, where the principle of development is accepted due to having access to a range of jobs, community facilities and services:

Tier One – Principal Centre: Exmouth

Tier Two – Main Centre: Axminster, Cranbrook, Honiton, Ottery St Mary, Seaton, Sidmouth

Tier Three – Local Centre: Broadclyst, Budleigh Salterton, Colyton, Lymington, Woodbury

Tier Four – Service Village: Beer, Branscombe,, **West Hill**, Whimple.

What will the West Hill Parish Council do?

The Parish Council is committed to keeping West Hill residents informed as the review progresses. We will:

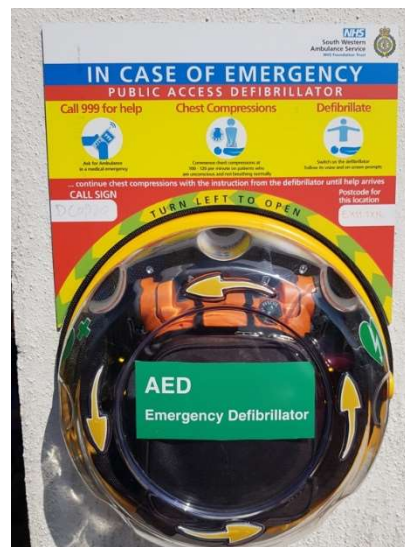
- Form a small working group to liaise with District Cllr Jess Bailey (who sits on the Strategic Planning Committee) to provide feedback and input into discussions of the Working Draft Local Plan
- Arrange public events to publicise the Draft Plan and facilitate consultation with our residents
- Make a formal consultation response to the Draft Local Plan
- Arrange further consultation events for the Publication Version of the Local Plan
- Keep the website www.westhillparishcouncil.gov.uk updated with latest details

Community Public Access Defibrillators (CPADs)

The Parish Council are pleased to announce the installation of two new defibrillators in West Hill.

We are grateful to West Hill's RBL for ensuring one is on their premises, and the other is installed at 11 Eastfield. Further, we thank JR Electricals for fitting the defibrillators.

The CPADs are fitted in conjunction with the South West Ambulance Service.

In the event of an emergency

If someone calls 999 for an ambulance and the call handler thinks that a CPAD could help **and** you live within 200 metres of the **RBL Clubhouse, School Lane** or **11 Eastfield** the caller handler will advise you to arrange for someone to collect the CPAD.

If you live outside the 200m area and think a CPAD could help in an emergency please arrange for someone to collect the CPAD. They are for public use. Please remember to return the device and advise the RBL or the Council that the device has been used.

- **Therefore, it's important everyone knows where defibrillators are available.**

There is also a CPAD at the Village Hall. The Parish Council is not responsible for this device.

A defibrillator is a device used to give an electric shock to help restart a patient's heart when they are in cardiac arrest. When someone suffers a cardiac arrest the heart stops and blood is no longer being pumped around their body. The longer they go without emergency life-support, the harder it is to restart their heart. Whilst 100% recovery cannot be guaranteed, it gives a patient the best chance.

Defibrillators are Easy to Use

On behalf of the Parish Council, South Western Ambulance Service ran a familiarisation course on 11th May. It was well attended and found to be useful.

If you couldn't attend the session please be assured that defibrillators are easy to use, instructions are available on the device. Also, in the event of an emergency, the 999 call handler will advise you what to do.

Other sites? Can you help? There's an opportunity for the Council to acquire a third CPAD for the village. We are still seeking a suitable location in the Higher Broadoak, Lower Broadoak or Hawkins Lane area. A gateway with electrical supply in a visible location would be preferable. If you think you can help, please contact the Parish Clerk. (contact details at the foot of the page)

Community First Responder (CFR) Team

The South West Ambulance Service is establishing and equipping a local team of Community First Responders. The three members are currently undergoing their training. CFRs attend particular types of medical emergencies where it is essential for the patient to receive immediate life-saving treatment or help. They are volunteers and are despatched by the ambulance service to give more immediate aid before an ambulance can arrive. Once it is operational, we will make sure you are made aware.

Responsible dog ownership

Owning a dog involves responsibilities as well as pleasures. The following basic tips can help prevent your dog from causing a nuisance:



- Train your dog in elementary obedience, so that it is under control at all times
- Make sure your dog is identified, at least with a collar and tag, and has been microchipped
- It is now a legal requirement in East Devon to always keep your dog on a lead on roads and on pavements next to roads. You should also keep your dog on a lead where there are other animals, for example when walking on a footpath through a livestock field
- Make sure that your garden is properly fenced so that your dog can't escape. Never let your dog out on its own, but take it for properly controlled exercise.
- Always carry a bag you can use to pick up after your dog. Take the waste home to your black rubbish bin or sack or use a litter or dog waste bin. Even better, train your dog to 'go at home'.
- Don't let your dog bark constantly - a well-trained dog is not one that barks at everyone and everything. Dogs that are kept outside for long periods often bark more. Find out when and why your dog barks and take steps to prevent it. We can give advice in the worst cases
- Don't leave your dog alone for long periods; dogs are pack animals and need companionship. Remember - you have a duty of care under the Animal Welfare Act 2006.
- your dog alone in a hot car, they can become dehydrated and even die in a very short time
- Sign up to Devon Loves Dogs www.devonlovesdogs.co.uk/joinus It's a free membership scheme for dog owners and dog walkers. You will get helpful tips on where to walk your dog and how to care for our beautiful coast and countryside. Join one of our free, regular waggys around the area. You can get a free goodie bag too!

Remember, dogs live for about 14 years, so think hard before you take on such a responsibility. If you can no longer keep your dog, contact a re-homing charity or environmental health on 01395 517456 for help. Do not put your dog out onto the street where it could be injured or cause an accident.
