Coronavirus is no joke!



The first day of this month is traditionally April Fool's Day, a time for pranks and high-jinks. But the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak is no joke.

Anyone can get it. Anyone can spread it. So please, stay home, protect the NHS and save lives. Only going out for the following reasons:

- To buy food or medicine
- To attend health appointments
- To take exercise
- or for essential work that cannot be done at home.

If you must go out, make sure you stay two metres (6ft) away from other people and wash your hands as soon as you get

home.

Devon needs you: get a job in health and social care



We're encouraging job seekers, students back from university, college leavers and former care and health staff to help support the county's most vulnerable.

The coronavirus outbreak (COVID-19) means there's an even greater demand for Healthcare Assistants in residential homes, people's own homes and hospitals in Devon so temporary and permanent workers are needed to fill a variety of shift work.

You don't necessarily need qualifications or previous work experience. What's important are your values and attitude towards working with people who need care, and your ability to cope in challenging environments.

Avoid loan sharks



People worrying about money or struggling financially due to the ongoing situation with coronavirus (COVID-19) are being <u>urged to avoid loan sharks</u>.

Loan sharks are unregulated, often give cash loans without any paperwork and charge extortionate interest rates, which can be difficult to repay. Victims believe the loan shark is offering them a service, but their behaviour can quickly change if repayments are not met.

If you are concerned about your financial situation and need support, <u>Citizens Advice</u> has some useful information on their website.

<u>The Government has published helpful advice</u> if you are self-employed, claiming benefits or needing to make a claim for benefits and statutory sick pay. You can also find more details about <u>statutory sick pay</u> and about <u>making a new claim for universal credit online</u>.

Scams have increased during the coronavirus outbreak – up by 400% - so <u>please be aware and be careful</u> if you are asked to give out personal or financial information.

More funding available to support community action



We're giving more to support to local organisations helping to tackle the effects of coronavirus in their communities, by introducing a new grant of up to £5,000 as part of the COVID-19 Prompt Action Fund. There are now two separate grants available from the council through the fund; one of less than £500, which launched last week, and the new grant of up to £5,000.
