



WEST HILL Help Scheme – Update 5th June

We don't need an excuse, but did you know that It's Volunteer Week UK 1-8th June? On your behalf here's a

big thankyou to West Hill Volunteers, shopping buddies, neighbours and friends for supporting the community in West Hill.

Is the WHPC Help Scheme carrying on?

Following recent Government announcements the restrictions on Covid-19 Lockdown are beginning to be lifted. However it continues to be an uncertain time as we all adjust to the new guidelines. Some people may venture out of their homes whilst others remain more cautious.

The Parish Council will monitor the situation over the coming weeks as things settle down into a new "normal". We have to consider that some volunteers will be returning to work and we can't expect others to carry on indefinitely. However it's clear that shielded and vulnerable residents in the village will continue to need help. So here's the plan for the weeks ahead

- The **Help Scheme** is still here to help you. Please continue to call 01404 232 100. Our volunteers are keen to help, but fewer volunteers will be available.
- **Prescriptions** we'll continue to collect prescriptions but ask that you start to consider how you will get your prescription in the future. Could you sign up for a delivery or postal service? Could a friend or neighbour be your prescription buddy?
- **Shopping :** We know the majority of people have made arrangements for their shopping. In fact, the Help Scheme has received very few calls for help with shopping in the past few weeks. Taking this into account we'll no longer have a Volunteer rota for McColls deliveries, but if you need help with a Supermarket Shop/McColls delivery please call us on 01404 232 100.
- We'll no longer update the list of local suppliers offering **Grocery & Meal Deliveries** to the village but it will continue to be available on the news section of our website <u>www.westhillparishcouncil.gov.uk</u>
- Information we'll continue to signpost sources of useful information for you.

Call us on **01404 232 100** for help with any of the above or for general enquiries.

Many of you have kindly offered to meet the travel costs for our volunteers. Please be assured that the Parish Council agreed to meet these costs.

And, as many residents have suggested, the Parish Council plans a village event to celebrate the efforts of the village during Covid-19. As you will understand we just don't know when it will be!

- The Village Lengthsman, commissioned by the Parish Council has been busy over recent weeks
 - Road signs across the village have been cleaned for the first time in many years thankyou for your 0 many positive comments
 - Verges at road junctions have been cut to improve road safety, such as the Bendarroch Road B3180 0 junction. The Parish Council focuses on the areas not covered or cut infrequently by DCC Highways. For info, the Lengthsman didn't cut the verge with cowslips near the War Memorial!
 - Time for a socially-distanced picnic? Two picnic tables are soon to be installed in Broadoak Woodland (between Higher Broad Oak Road and Lower Broad Oak Road). Have fun but please respect the woodland and neighbours - remember to take your litter home and no fires or barbecues!
 - From 8th-10th June the Lengthsman team will be clearing the Himalayan Balsam weeds (tall plants with pink flowers) along a 200m stretch of West Hill Road, towards Ottery St Mary. We originally hoped to organise a community project to tackle these invasive weeds but this was not possible under Covid-19 restrictions. The weeds will come back again next year so we'll be asking for your help in 2021!
- And sadly.....one of our Parish Councillors, Quentin Tailford, is re-locating and has resigned from the Council. His knowledge and enthusiasm will be greatly missed. Broadband News: Jurassic Fibre (JF) broadband is now operational within Aylesbeare and it is expected the plan will be extended to West Hill in as little as 3 months' time, pending surveys. In place of a public consultation they will be offering a public webinar which will allow resident to register and attend to ask auestions
