Parish Council News

You may have noticed that the **Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS)** is now operational. The VAS is a speed warning device and will flash a warning message to remind drivers to slow down. It's not a speed camera so anyone who drives too fast will not receive a fine. However, we hope drivers will regard it as a reminder to be more considerate when travelling around our village lanes.



It will take some time to fully understand how and where the sign will have the greatest impact on reducing traffic speeds. Initially the VAS device will be moved every two weeks between the sites that have been agreed with Devon Highways. The device collects a wealth of data and Councillors plan to regularly add a VAS report to the website. If you are unable to access the website please contact the Parish Clerk for details. Here's a snapshot of the data collected between 4th-18th December 2020

- Location: B3180, nr Little Stockleigh facing Tipton Cross.
- Over the period 34,090 vehicles passed the sign. Each day between 40-60% of total vehicles, exceeded the 30mph speed limit. The average speed of speeding vehicles was approx 35mph.
- The maximum speed recorded was 60mph at 9.15pm on 6th Dec.
